Send your children to a free, safe, outdoor festival at West Park on Saturday 3rd August.

A few weeks ago we sent a flyer for every secondary school age pupil in Wolverhampton to all local secondary schools. (Primary school children can also attend but should be accompanied by an adult). Tickets are free but they must be booked in advance HERE

The festival has perimeter fencing and security. 18 local providers and visiting artists are providing free arts and cultural activity alongside the main stage curated by The Music Service. There is dance, visual arts, music, karaoke, food, fitness and information stalls.
